Planning your primary research

- 1. What information do you need?
 - Narrow your topic
 - Start with background research
 - Use this to find keywords
 - Use your background research and keywords to create research questions to answer
 - Remember the difference between qualitative and quantitative data- which do you need?

2. What methods will you use?

- Choose the best methods of primary research for the information you need
- Logistical questions
 - o If an observation, what will you observe and where will you find it?
 - o If you are interviewing someone, how will you reach out to them?
 - o If you are conducting surveys, who will you survey?
 - If you are conducting experiments, where will you do them, what equipment will you need and how will you get it?
- 3. What will be the best way to collect that information?
 - Use your keywords and research questions to form questions/plan your observations/plan your experiments
 - Are you approaching your primary research with any bias, and how will you avoid that when you are conducting your primary research?
 - How will you organize and present your data when you have it?
