Crime books are stories about mysteries, crime, and crime-solving.

- Crime novels began to be published in the 1800s.
- Arthur Conan Doyle's Sherlock Holmes stories were among the first crime novels, as were Edgar Allen Poe's stories.
- The 'Golden Age' of crime fiction was from 1920 to around 1940.
- In the 1940s many crime novels were adapted into film noir films.

There are different types of crime novels

Cosy mysteries have an amateur detective, are set in a small town or country house, and the violence isn't described in detail.

Hard-boiled detective stories have explicit violence, are set in the underbelly of a big city, and the detective will break the rules.

Legal thrillers are about what happens in the legal system after the crime has been committed. The main characters are lawyers.

Forensic thrillers are about a medical examiner or pathologist following a trail of forensic evidence.

Traditional crime stories or *whodunnits* are plot-driven, and the reader follows a series of clues about the crime.

Police procedurals are about a member of the police force, who has to follow regulations.
